Over the holidays, we were incredibly lucky to have a team from Naturform Melton come to the school, donating their time and materials to improve our school environment. We also had many improvement made to our gardens and general tidiness.

Playground and classroom behaviours

Whilst our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support team have been working very hard with our staff to reinforce the positive behaviours with our students, there are a small number of young people who can make some 'mistakes' when in class or on the playground. As a leadership team, we have spoken to several staff and students and a decision has been made that certain playground games will no longer be permitted during school time. The reason for this is the impact on learning time. Some of these games could be perceived as Bullying and the school has a zero tolerance of these behaviours. Staff will be making reports directly to the Leadership Team if they believe there are any instances of Bullying and the corresponding consequences will be implemented.

Planning for 2019

This term we are compiling staffing and class groups. Staff will be indicating what has been successful and challenging in the combinations of students and we will be asking students for their feedback also. The final Curriculum Day this term will be an SSG meeting where you will be able to meet the new staff for classes next year. Please save the date!

STUDENT TRANSPORT 2019

At the end of Term 3 we sent out an Expression of Interest form to all families. This information will enable us to distribute our Department of Education allocated resources to the students who meet eligibility requirements for Transport Assistance.

If your child would like to either start using or continue using the school bus service, please return these forms immediately to the Administration Office. Where appropriate, additional forms will be distributed to you to formalise the application.

If your child is ready to transition to independent travel they can access a Yearly Public Transport Student Pass through Conveyance Allowance Assistance. Staff will be contacting the families of students who are ready to undertake this exciting step towards increased independence.

As part of the building project we are constructing a bike/scooter parking area so there will be space to securely park active travel equipment. We would love to see more students and families using active travel to get to school, especially now as the lovely weather is with us once again.

In 2019 there will be changes to existing routes and stops to ensure that students who live in the transport priority area (more than 4.8km from the school) will have their travel requirements met as a priority over those who live closer to the school. This will mean decreased travel times for students who live further from the school and less stops for all travellers. More information regarding the routes and stops will be distributed to all families who have applied for transport assistance in the second last week of this term.

Please notes some general information regarding access to transport assistance below. This information was contained in the Family Guide distributed at the end of Term 3. A copy is available on our website.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES TRANSPORT PROGRAM (SDTP) FAMILY GUIDELINES

Parents/guardians have the primary responsibility for transporting their children to and from school - Attendance at a specialist or integrated school does not automatically entitle a student to assistance or preclude parents from being primarily responsible for their child's transport arrangements.

An application can be made to the school to access travel assistance. At this time the family and student agrees to meet all of the Conditions of Travel.

The application is received and then the student's access is measured against the eligibility criteria.

An assessment will be made as to their fitness to travel on the available services.

There will be a meeting to develop an Individual Travel Plan for the student.

If applicable the families will need to provide all necessary equipment to enable the student to travel safely and in accordance with the Individual Travel Plan.

The student will then begin access to the chosen travel service. This is on a trail basis and additional meetings and equipment may be required if appropriate.

If there are any questions or concerns in relation to your child's travel please contact the Student Transport Administrator during office hours.

COMPLUSORY UNIFORM BEGINS IN 2019

The 12 month change over period has nearly finished for the introduction of our new school uniform.

Many families have taken the opportunity to stagger the purchasing of pieces of uniform during the last three terms of the school year.

Our uniform shop is open every **Wednesday from 3pm to 4.30pm** if you wish to try on samples to get the right sizing for your child.

You can pick up an Order Form from our office or download one from our Website. If you cannot make it to the shop in Wednesday nights please bring the order and correct payment to the Administration Office to be processed. Just a reminder that we ONLY ACCEPT CASH PAYMENTS. EFTPOS will be introduced in 2019.

Please note that the last uniform shop for the year will be Wednesday 12th December. No orders will be accepted after this time. The shop will reopen on Tuesday January 29th 2019 9am.

We do have some stock on hand of most sizes so please place orders very soon. There could be a lead time of 2--3 weeks between ordering and receipt if the pieces are not in stock.

We thank families for their continued support in the introduction of our new school uniform.

The Student Dress Code Policy will be enforced in 2019 so please make yourself familiar with the requirements. Copies are available from the Administration Office and it can be found on our Website.

NDIS INFORMATION

As many of you may have heard the NDIS Local Area Coordinator for Melton has been appointed. They are the Brotherhood of St Laurance.



The new Melton NDIS Office is now open and is located at High Street Melton (old Westpac Bank) near IGA.

There are many free information sessions that are being hosted to support families through the application process. Keep a look out on social media or for flyer in our newsletter.

We have had an increase in requests for support in filling out forms for the NDIS. Unfortunately we are unable to carry out this task, but can supply copies of reports held in your child's student file. We cannot create new reports to support the application, this is something that your child's medical practitioners can assist you with.

If you do require copies of student related reports, please send and email to melton.ss@edumail.vic.gov.au or phone 97434966. Please allow a minimum of 5 working days for the request to be processed. Please note that copies of Cognitive Assessments can only be collected directly from the Administration Office and not handed to your child to bring home.

We thank you for your patience with these processes.

WE ARE A SUNSMART SCHOOL

Melton Specialist School is a sun smart school, all students must bring a hat to school during terms 1 and 4 for outdoor play.

Our SunSmart policy is on our website for further information, attached is what is recommended by SunSmart when buying a suitable hat for your child.

Broad-brimmed hat*

Brims should shade the face, neck and ears.



Bucket hat*

Bucket or surfer-style hats should have a deep crown and sit low on the head. The angled brim should provide the face, neck and ears with plenty of shade.



Legionnaire hat

Legionnaire hats should have a flap that covers the ears and back of the neck to the collarbone/ shoulder. The side flap and front peak should overlap to protect the side of the face.

BUILDING WORKS UPDATE

There have been some dramatic changes to the front of our school since building works began at the start of the year.
