ACCESS CHANGES TO OUR SCHOOL

RECEPTION AREA HAS MOVED

The new buildings will be active when students return to school in Term 2. Please note that the old RECEPTION area has returned to being a classroom.

NEW PEDESTRIAN ENTRANCE

Please enter the school via our new Pedestrian gate (Gate 3) that is located AFTER the car park exit. This path will take you directly to our new Administration Building.

NEW RECEPTION AREA

There are automatic doors into our new reception area. The second automatic door will be permanently locked for security purposes. An intercom is located on the right hand wall for you to use to speak with staff who will unlock the door once the purpose of your visit has been announced.

CAR PARKING PROCEDURES


There will be two carparks at MSS. The new carpark behind the new buildings is for staff car parking only. The gate to this car park will be locked from 8.30am to 3.15pm. This is to ensure safety of our students that have classrooms adjacent to this area.

Families and Visitors need to use the car park at the front of the school or parking that is available in the slip road. The gates to this car park will be locked from 8.30am to 9.15am and from 2.30pm to 3.15pm to allow for safe arrival and departures of the school buses.

All of the school buses will be parking inside the school car park. We have made a request to Melton City Council that the Bus Parking Zone immediately in front of the school is returned to 15 minute parking.

STUDENT PICK UP AND DROP OFF AREA

This will remain in the same spot and is open from 8.45am to 9.00am and 2.30pm to 3.15pm. All students must be supervised by their guardian until the teacher collects them from this area.

We would also like to acknowledge Keeley Johnson on being awarded a Youth Award for Contributing to improving outcomes of people with a disability (12-18 years of age).


Keeley has created a foundation to support students with Autism or an intellectual disability with an opportunity to receive an iPad that will support their learning and communication.

Well Done Keeley!




ALLIED HEALTH TEAM NEWS

As part of Tuning Into Teens, you will be provided with assistance and training in:

- Gaining an understanding of your teenager/s development and how this may impact their behaviour
- Understanding your teenager/s emotional processes
- Helping your teenager/s understand and manage their own emotional reactions
- Communicating more effectively with your teenager/s
- Supporting your teenager/s as they grow towards independence
- Understanding the effects of social media and technology and how to parent effectively in the modern age


