CAMP, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

Just a reminder if your child is now over the age of 16 and has received their own pension card from Centrelink held in their name, we do encourage them to apply for CSEF in 2021. To apply please complete the form on the next page and provide evidence of your child's pension card to the office to photocopy or feel free to email the documents directly to the school melton.ss@education.vic.gov.au

For those who received CSEF in 2020, and have a child under the age of 16 we will re-apply on your behalf. This means you **do not** need to complete the form on the next page unless your details have changed. If in doubt please fill in the form and return to school.

To all new families and students who wish to apply for CSEF, please complete the form and return to the office. If still unsure about the process or if you have any questions please contact the office on 03 9743 4966.



CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder. OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see:

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (28 January 2020) or term two (14 April 2020).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2020 closes on 26 June, 2020.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

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PBS - THE CLASSROOM

One of the most important parts of the PBS philosophy is effective classroom design, which is individualised to that particular group of students and their needs. The manner in which a classroom is organised can have a major impact on the way students learn and interact with their environment. It also provides teachers with the capacity to recognise, assess and plan appropriately for individual students.

When setting up a successful classroom environment it is the teachers aim to improve student outcomes and for them to achieve their goals. There are a variety of factors that are essential when setting up these spaces, such as; its physical lay-out, which allows for ease of movement and access to resources. Student work is displayed to highlight success, but it is displayed in such a way that minimises student distraction. The Allied Health team also provides assistance with lighting, temperature and ventilation requirements that may impact student performance. As well as the placement of furniture and other bigger items.

Alongside classroom design is the utilisation of individual student schedules to provide structure and predictability to the students' day. Scheduling and timetabling also permits the teacher to structure sessions successfully, by considering appropriate groupings and staff allocation. Another requirement of PBS is the use of a reward system, which has been revamped and rolled-out across the whole school to provide uniformity and reinforce our school values of Safe, Responsible and Respectful. Our Reward System will be discussed further in the next newsletter as it has just been adapted to better suit our needs.



A WORD FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE - NOTIFICATION OF A CASE OF CHICKEN POX AT MSS

Hello MSS Community, Just for your information and to be aware that there is a case of confirmed Chicken Pox at our school. The symptoms of chickenpox can include:

- low-grade fever
- general discomfort, illness or lack of wellbeing (malaise)
- intensely itchy skin rash appears as small blisters surrounded by irregularly-shaped patches of inflamed skin. The blisters first form on the body and later on the head and limbs. They usually burst and develop crusts after about five days
- ulcers may develop in certain areas, including the mouth and vagina.

For chickenpox, the time from infection to the appearance of the rash (incubation period) is around 14 to 16 days. A few days before the appearance of the rash, the person may feel feverish and have a sore throat and headache. The skin may be marked for some months after the rash has cleared.

Any student with a case of Chicken Pox is to remain at home until all the blisters have dried up, possibly 5 days after the eruption. If you are concerned;
