#### Rebuild Update

We have been meeting with our Design Team weekly and on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> May the architects met with students, staff and our school council. It was so great to see our school community get excited about the next stage of our buildings works and the ideas presented. Representatives from our school community were shown the DRAFT Masterplan documents and were able to ask questions and provide feedback to the Design Team. We look forward to taking all the feedback back to the design team and seeing if it can be included in the new designs.

#### Staffing Update

This term we have continued to grow in student numbers with enrolments increasing – this has also meant we have had to recruit new staff and make changes to our classroom staffing. It has also been incredibly challenging for us to recruit and employ Casual Relief Staff. We are now seeing the long-term impacts of COVID in our school. Students, staff and their families seem to be catching multiple sicknesses and needing to be away from school. Given the circumstances, sometimes we are unable to fill casual vacancies and have had to split classes. We apologise for the impact to our students and want to reassure you that we are working behind the scenes to try and avoid multiple changes to classes.
